## NEWS YOU CAN USE

### Cell Phone 'Free' Helpful Apps

If you *fall or need help and can't reach your cell phone*, you can still use it to secure help. Both iPhones and Android phones has this

- **iPhone:** go to 'Settings', then 'Siri & Search'. Make sure 'Listen for Hey Siri' is on. In an emergency just say, 'Hey Siri, call 911'.
- **Android:** make sure 'OK Google' is turned on, then when needed, say 'OK Google, call 911'.

If you *can reach your phone but can't speak up*.

- Androids and iPhones let you call 911 by pressing the 'sleep/wake' button five times.

If *you're stranded, experience a medical issue or a car accident*, these 'free' apps can guide rescuers to you. From the App Store on your cell phone:

- Download the 'free' app called 'SirenGPS'. If in need, it sends your location and a message that you need help to first responders.
- This app 'Zello Walkie-Talkie' connects you with others near you, including first responders, looking to coordinate rescue efforts.

### Our February Speakers:

We had three lovely ladies from the **Low Country Herb Society** that provided us with some great information and useful household tips. Below is the recipe for the Household Cleaner that was made during our meeting.



## DIY Household Cleaner

Using Distilled White Vinegar as a base for a general household cleaner has many advantages. It is far less expensive than toxic commercial cleaners and it kills or reduces pathogens such as E. Coli and salmonella ([www.healthline.com](http://www.healthline.com)). Combining the white vinegar with Rosemary or Sage increases its effectiveness because of their antimicrobial and antifungal properties ([www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov](http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov)).

### Tools:

- Bell jar or similar container with a tight lid.
- Citrus peels (collect orange, tangerine, grapefruit, lemon, lime, etc.) in the freezer until ready to use.
- White, Distilled Vinegar (in the cleaning or vinegar section of the grocery store)
- Essential Oil of your choice
- Sprig of rosemary or sage
- Spray bottle

### Directions:

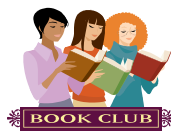
1. Fill a jar with citrus peels.
2. Pour in vinegar to the top and seal tightly.
3. Place the jar in a sunny window for two weeks, shaking once daily.
4. After two weeks, strain the vinegar into a spray bottle.
5. Add a few drops of essential oil of your choice, a few drops of tee tree oil, and a sprig of rosemary or sage. Put the top on the spray bottle and shake gently.

**Note: Do NOT use this on granite or marble.**

<b><u>President's Pick:</u></b>	<b><i>Barnabas Horse Foundation:</i></b> whose mission is to provide equine assisted therapy for individuals and families recovering from a traumatic experience and/or to improve the quality of life of children and adults with disabilities through human and horse interaction. Barnabas is a volunteer-run organization developed to encourage hope and healing through fellowship with horses for abused and traumatized children, women in crisis and Veterans. Utilizing the equine assisted therapy model, they work hand in hand with therapists and clients and with the horse at no cost.
<b><u>Board Pick:</u></b>	<b><i>Associated Charities:</i></b> whose mission is to show love and compassion to better the lives of people through quality charitable service. There are no paid employees, only dedicated volunteers who give their time to keep our programs intact and ongoing to better the lives of others. They work closely with other agencies, companies and ministries to provide quality charitable services. Every Tuesday is Giveaway Day for the homeless and others that need assistance. Clients may shop for clothing, housewares, linens, books, Bibles, hygiene products and receive food items at no charge.
<b><u>Board Pick:</u></b>	<b><i>Children's Recovery Center:</i></b> whose mission is to provide a safe environment where caring team members investigate allegations of child abuse, while providing the support necessary in restoring hope in children's lives. Their objective is to provide a safe place where children who are victims of abuse can receive a coordinated child abuse investigation. Children receive a forensic medical exam, forensic interview, advocacy and education. Each child is assigned a child advocate who will ensure they are kept safe and that their rights are protected. CRC wants children who come to the center to grow from child abuse victims to strong healthy survivors.
<b><u>Purple Bucket:</u></b>	<b><i>Family Justice City of Horry and Georgetown:</i></b> whose mission is to reduce the injuries and deaths resulting from domestic violence. We work with local agencies to provide comprehensive coordinated services to victims of domestic violence and educational programs for our community.

We must maintain a strict schedule; if you arrive late, you may not receive the full 60 minutes in your room. The fun starts immediately.
