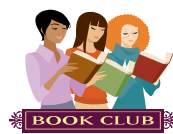

**Newcomers Selected Charities for 2023-2024**

Each August, our Newcomers Board and our President select the charitable and service organizations that we will be working to help support during the year. Also, at every monthly Coffee and Luncheon, a Purple Bucket will be passed for your voluntary contribution to a registered charity that the Board has selected for that month.

<b><u>President's Pick:</u></b>	<p><b><u>Help for Kids/Backpack Buddies:</u></b></p> <p><b>Mission:</b> Help for Kids provides food for hungry children of Horry County who through no fault of their own do not have enough to eat on a daily basis. Backpack Buddies provides food on the weekends. Teachers and school administrators identify the children in need. They also provide backpacks filled with school supplies when school starts, and a week's worth of clothing and a pair of shoes as needed. They are now making and delivering almost 3,000 food packs per week!</p>
<b><u>Board Pick:</u></b>	<p><b><u>CHANGE: The Board has voted to replace Eastern Carolina Homelessness Organization (ECHO) with Meals on Wheels as their pick. Many requests to have ECHO speak at a Newcomers Coffee went unanswered, so the decision was made to choose a charity that was more responsive to our choosing them as a main charity. We have chosen to retain ECHO as a Purple Bucket charity. A representative of Meals on Wheels will speak at a Newcomer's Coffee in 2024.</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Meals on Wheels of Horry &amp; Georgetown Counties, Inc.:</u></b></p> <p><b>Mission:</b> To provide nutritious home delivered meals, as well as compassion, hope, assistance, fellowship, and the love of Jesus to those who are or have family that is classified homebound, elderly, and terminally ill in Horry and Georgetown Counties. Their vision is to "Deliver God's Love One Meal at a Time" in order to transform the lives of those we serve by sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ, focusing on the whole being, upholding the sanctity of life, and dealing with their current nutritional needs.</p>
<b><u>Purple Bucket:</u></b>	<p><b><u>Eastern Carolina Homelessness Organization (ECHO):</u></b></p> <p><b>Mission:</b> To break the cycles homelessness experienced by individuals and families in our community. ECHO provides homeless permanent housing solutions with supportive services as well as eviction prevention services for persons that are at-risk of becoming homeless. Their Vision is for every person experiencing a housing crisis to find a place to call home. They believe that people experiencing homelessness need the safety and stability of a home to address challenges, pursue opportunities, and ultimately grow and thrive in our community.</p>
